

Born in 1997, Tim Henning Lüttge starts his career as an undergraduate with Professor Michael Achilles at the University of Music Detmold. He continues to study transverse flute and musical education at the Universities of Music in Detmold and Köln. Later, he holds a scholarship under solo flutist Andreas Blau with the Berliner Philharmoniker.

He is awarded numerous prizes at national and international competitions. He is also a scholar of the Dr.-Richard-Carl-Dörken-Foundation, the "Villa Musica", the Yehudi-Menuhin-Foundation and, in 1997, nominated "Soloist of the Year" at the renowned youth contest "Jugend Musiziert".

In addition, he repeatedly wins the first national prize, the special prize of the foundation "Deutsches Musikleben" and further awards at the German University Contest for Flute, the International World Music Festival Kerkrade and receives the Arts Award of the National Association Lippe.

Tim Henning Lüttge frequently performs as soloist with international orchestras. Among them, the SWR Radio Symphony Orchestra Stuttgart, the State Orchestra Frankfurt, the Chamber Orchestra Cologne, the Orchestre de Chambre de Lausanne, the State Orchestra Istanbul, the Gulbenkian Orchestra, the Bergische Symphoniker, the Bielefelder Sinfoniker, the Südwestfälische Philharmoniker, the New Rhineland Chamber Orchestra, the Youth State Orchestra Hessen, Rhineland-Palatinate und Lower Saxony and the university orchestras of Cologne and Detmold playing at venues such as the Philharmonic Concert Hall Cologne, the Philharmonic Concert Hall Berlin, the Gewandhaus Leipzig, the Tonhalle Zurich, the Festspielhaus Baden-Baden, the Palau de la Musica Barcelona, Auditorio Nacional de Madrid, Petronas Philharmonic Concert Hall Kuala Lumpur and Tchaikowsky Concert Hall Moskau.

As soloist and orchestra musician he has contributed towards numerous CD productions, radio broadcasting and TV shows.

As a music teacher he dedicates great interest to promoting young talent and has been teaching in Hamburg for several years. In the recent past, his students have achieved first prizes at national "Jugend Musiziert" contests and international youth contests. Many of them are currently studying music at university.

He also commits himself to the project "Rhapsody in Schools," which was founded by pianist Lars Vogt in September 2005.

He engages in national and international music contests as a juror, lectures youth orchestras and teaches master classes for amateur and professional musicians.
